# Report

The much-promised arctic blast from the north arrived on the morning of the game making a dramatic contrast with the weather the previous weekend. The result was it was significantly colder in the afternoon than it was the previous Friday evening.

March kicked off and Renegades took the ball solidly. A bit of to-ing and fro-ing happened before Harry broke through the defence and gave to Callum who made many yards before putting the ball through the hands to Jack Weatherly who scored. The wind made the conversion and it pulled to the left, 5-0. From the kickoff, Callum bashed his way through the March defence and made a good 50m. Play stopped while Machine limped off with a twisted ankle. Jack Mills came on as prop, moving Elliot to the back row. Renegades applied the pressure and advanced towards the March line. The re-start saw Dan take the ball near the touchline and make yards before offloading to Harry who ran half the length of the pitch to score again, 82-0. The conversion missed. And finally, Harry made a strong run before offloading to Ollie who scored. The conversion messed, 87-0. The final whistle went, and everyone headed for the dressing room as quickly as the formalities would allow.

It was a good game to watch. There was plenty of skilful rugby. It wasn't much fun for March, but they stuck at it and were very sociable afterwards. The weather was some of the worst ever.
