Report

The conversion was well struck but clipped the outside of the post to go wide, 5-12.

The score lifted Renegades and they went on the offensive again. A nice through the hands came to Mikey well inside the Hadleigh 22. He delivered a cheeky dink through for Tobi to follow. It very nearly came off. The referee called play back for an offside infringement by Hadleigh. Stockers slotted the penalty, 8-12. That's how it stayed at half time.
